6 FINANCE COMMITTEE REPORT

Erica Hodgson

- EH explained an omission from the previous Q3 report, which added £310 to the total for Capital Expenditure and reduced the % of the annual budget remaining under this heading to 16.22%. She sought re-approval of the Q3 report with this correction. **Prop. EH; Sec. DGr. APPROVED**
- EH summarised the ballpark quotes that have come in for fencing the Ashley Piece play area. So far it seems that metal fencing for such a large area would come to about £20K. DE said she felt further advice should be sought from RoSPA about what would be involved and what we might realistically hope to achieve by spending so much money. It was agreed that this matter should be discussed at the upcoming Play Areas Committee meeting and reported back at the March PC meeting. **ACTION – EH/DE**
- EH has reviewed the Financial Standing Orders and **these were approved**. More work is required on the Asset Register and Financial Risk Analysis, and approval for these documents will sought at the March meeting. **ACTION - EH**
- EH asked for councillors' suggestions about where pavement repairs could usefully be carried out this year; DE nominated the pavements around the Knowledge Crescent play area. Other suggestions will be discussed at the March PC meeting. **ACTION - ALL**

7 PLAY AREAS REPORT

Denise Edwards

- DE reported that four items of rotting wood and metal seating have been dumped on the community orchard area. The PC will attempt to find out who carried out this flytipping, and why. It was agreed that it will need to be disposed of, which will be at the expense of the PC i.e. the village, if the culprit is not found.
- No other concerns have been raised about play areas this month.
- DE added to her earlier comment about fencing the play areas, that RoSPA's advice should be sought about the number of gates needed. DE to arrange committee meeting to discuss this and the repairs to ground at Whittonditch. **ACTION -DE**

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8 ALLOTMENTS

Denise Edwards

- DE reported that three new ploholders have already been welcomed to the site this year. A few half-plots and quarter-plots are still available. Anyone wishing to view the site can do so by emailing allotments@ramsbury.org or via text 07867921878.
- The first meeting of the new Allotment Committee was held on 12th February, at which their future plans were reviewed and next steps forward were agreed.
- DE expressed her thanks to Josh Talmage for his work on the surrounding hedges, which are looking fabulous, and a further step forward in their regeneration plans.

9 RIGHTS OF WAY COMMITTEE REPORT

Doug Greenway

- DGr reported that the monthly circular walk on Sunday 1st February was the wettest ever but seven local stalwarts enjoyed the walk with him. The next walk on March 1st will go to Whittonditch via Marring Hill; more details are on the website and there will be posters. **ACTION - DGr**
- DGr has checked on the state of the overgrown hedges on bridleway 28 and was pleased to say that they have been very well cut back now.
- Further preparations for this year's Boundary Walk on Sunday 3rd May have been made – Ramsbury Brewery have confirmed they can host the lunch stop, letters have gone out to all the landowners and the participation of the scouts in the walk is under discussion. (They have agreed to do bacon butties)
- SG will contact the Ramsbury Run organisers to make sure they are aware that Lofts Bridge is unlikely to be repaired and reopened in time so they will probably need to re-route this year's run. **ACTION - SG**

10 EMERGENCY COMMITTEE REPORT

Alison Foale

- AF reported an Emergency Committee meeting was held on 11th February to primarily discuss the acquisition of two new generators for our village hubs and the quotes for the new defibrillator for Whittonditch Road.
- SG gave a detailed summary of the generator quote which suits our requirements very well. She proposed we go ahead and accept the Hampshire Generators quote for the two generators of £3,326.63 + VAT. **Prop: SG; Seconded:CM. APPROVED** **ACTION - SG TO PURCHASE**
- Arrangements have been made for the old generators to be removed prior to installation of the new ones.
- SG proposed that the quote for a new defibrillator of £1,369.99 incl. VAT should be accepted. **Prop. SG; Sec: AF. APPROVED** **ACTION - SG TO PURCHASE**
- MT was not at the meeting, but it had been unanimously agreed at the January meeting that the PC should go ahead and buy the six pack of walkie-talkies he recommended. **ACTION – AF/MT**
- The committee agreed to ask wardens to clear drain tops in their area. **ACTION – SG/AF**

11 VILLAGE MAINTENANCE

Sheila Glass

- SG and DB had a meeting on 30th January with a representative of Redhand CCTV, who had approached us last autumn claiming to supply redeployable CCTV. It quickly became apparent that their installations are not redeployable (by our definition) at all and would be no good for our purposes so the meeting was a waste of time and SG will write to confirm we will not be taking the matter further. **ACTION – SG**
- It was agreed that a green grit bin should be purchased for approx. £120, to be located near the bench at the top of Chapel Lane. SG will order it and write to the local residents about it being their responsibility to keep it filled from the supply of bags at the Recreation Centre. **Prop. DB; Sec. CM. APPROVED** **ACTION - SG**
- After the meeting with Alex Young from Aster, there had been an improvement in the situation but SG and other councillors will continue to keep an eye on the storage of wheelie bins at Saxon Forge.

12 NATURE RESERVE**Chris Morgan**

- CM said he and SG had had a very useful meeting that morning with Anna Forbes from ARK and Nick Self from Wiltshire Wildlife Trust at which they discussed the current water level, and the wider issue of the way in which the water meadows protect the village from the river flooding. CM will take photos periodically to record how the water levels may rise and fall. There had also been a discussion of the way the weir behind the fire station can get blocked from time to time, and the worry this often creates for the residents of the houses on the High Street beyond the fire station. It was suggested that it might be possible to have the weir removed as it seems to serve no useful purpose, and CM and Anna Forbes will investigate this.

ACTION - CM

- CM drew councillors' attention to the way in which the future of the fire station might be important for the Nature Reserve as the equipment used now by WWT to cut back vegetation is too bulky to be transported along the footpath and they have been permitted to bring it on site over the fire station land. SG said she would go through the archive to investigate whether that path is a right of way, or it belongs to Wilts CC.

SG confirmed that two public consultations about the closure of our fire station will be held in the Memorial Hall, one on **2nd March (6.00-8.00)** and another on **3rd March (10.30-12.30)**. There will also be a dial-in session on **April 25th from 6.00-7.00p.m.** DE will post the dates of these meetings on social media and SG will publicise on the website, in Whitton Ways and on the noticeboards.

ACTION – SG/DE

SG proposed that the PC wait to see what comes out of these meetings before starting to make representations opposing the closure.

DE confirmed that the Horticultural Society meeting on the evening of 2nd March will be re-scheduled to April 19th to avoid clashing with the fire station public meeting.
